## Purpose:

To offer residential home builders alternatives to providing assurances for new driveways connecting to MCDOT roadways.

References: Maricopa County Resolution for Permits to work in Dedicated

Maricopa County Right-of-Way (Resolution 2001-01)

## **Policy/ Procedures:**

- Resolution 2001-01 sets forth procedures for permitting new construction in MCDOT right-of-way (R/W), part of which requires permittees to provide a performance bond in the sum of up to 100% of the amount of the cost of the work prior to permit issuance. This bond is required as a means to guarantee that the work will be constructed in accordance with the permit requirements.
- 2. Maricopa County Planning and Development (PND) issues numerous permits on behalf of MCDOT for residential driveways, most of which require performance bonds of \$5,000 or less.
- 3. The process to accept, track and refund bonds is an onerous task for both the County and single family residential builders, who are also financially burdened by this requirement.
- 4. The same or better level of guarantee for driveway completion can be attained by conditioning building permits issued by PND (concurrent with MCDOT R/W Permits) such that the final drainage inspection not be approved until such time that the driveway, as shown on the approved plan(s), is completed. This in essence creates a certificate of occupancy hold. The same condition would be added to the MCDOT R/W Permit which is signed by the permittee.
- 5. Placing the inspection conditions in the building permit and R/W permit would negate the financial burden for single family home builders to provide performance guarantees and reduce administrative processing (accepting and returning) of the guarantees by the County.
- 6. Adding the permit conditions would not result in any additional fees to applicants but would reduce their financial obligations by giving them the option to not provide a performance guarantee.
- 7. Effective immediately, applicants for single family residence building permits, who also require a MCDOT R/W driveway permit, and whose estimated driveway cost is \$5,000 or less, shall have the option of accepting the condition as part of both the building permit and the R/W permit, that the final drainage inspection for the building permit will not be approved until such time that the driveway has been constructed in accordance with the approved plans.

- 8. Applicants shall also have the option of providing a cash or bond guarantee in accordance with Resolution 2001-01.
- 9. For clarity, the permit condition shall further state that failure to construct the driveway will result in the inability to occupy the building.
- 10. This Directive only applies to MCDOT R/W permits issued by PND, where PND also issues a Building permit for the subject location.
