Evaluation

Aim: compare information obtained from both surveys (during pre/post-heat season) and to analyze and evaluate this data to learn if any changes in knowledge and perceptions, heat-related illness, use of home cooling systems, awareness and use of utility assistance programs and neighborhood resources, and the effect of COVID-19 on the household occurred
